DISPLAY POLICY

1. Purposes of display

- Give purpose and value to children's work.
- Celebration of children's achievements.
- Stimulate children's learning and interest in all areas of the curriculum.
- Reflect the positive ethos of the school.
- Create a welcoming and aesthetically pleasing environment.
- Provide an opportunity to look at others' work.
- To inform and inspire parents, carers, governors, teachers and visitors to the school.

2. Aims

At Christ Church we aim to:

- ensure that all children's efforts are valued through display, promoting equal opportunity for all;
- provide stimulating interactive environments that give opportunities for questions and discussions;
- display work from all areas of the curriculum;
- change displays regularly, when appropriate, so as to reflect recent activities;
- to give children the opportunity to discuss what should be displayed, and how, as they progress through the school;
- to encourage a higher standard of work, so that children present their work, both for display and in their books, neatly;
- exhibit displays with careful attention to detail, ensuring that children's work is shown to its full potential;
- to show progression through the Key Stages.

3. Mounting

- Displays should have titles to reflect the work on display.
- The child's voice needs to be represented in displays, where appropriate.

4. Other considerations

It is important to make sure that:

- all work and titles are mounted;
- displays are not overcrowded;
- borders are added to the displays;
- displays are relevant;
- working walls should reflect current learning.
